Join us Fridays at 1:30 p.m. in the Lower Level Community Room as we play older movies around a theme.

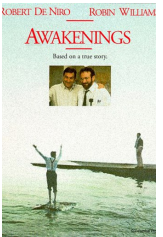
March 6 - *The Trouble with Angels* (111 minutes) Rated PG

Two mischievous students make a nuisance of themselves at a convent boarding school run by a head nun who has a devil of a time dealing with the unholy duo's pranks and practical jokes. Directed by Ida Lupino, this 1966 comedy stars Hayley Mills and Rosalind Russell, with an appearance by famous burlesque dancer Gypsy Rose Lee.



March 13 - *Awakenings* (121 minutes) Rated PG-13

Based on a true story, Dr. Malcolm Sayer is a shy research physician who uses an experimental drug to "awaken" the catatonic victims of a rare disease. The awakening of the first patient proves a rebirth for the doctor, too, as the patient reveals life's simple but sweet pleasures to the introverted doctor. Directed by Penny Marshall, this 1990 biopic stars Robert De Niro and Robin Williams.



March 20 - *Eve's Bayou* (109 minutes) Rated R

After a daughter witnesses her father having an affair, she begins a chain reaction that could tear her seemingly perfect family apart. Directed by Kasi Lemmons, this 1997 drama stars Samuel L. Jackson, Jurnee Smollett-Bell, and Meagan Good.



March 27 - *Winter's Bone* (100 minutes) Rated R

An unflinching Ozark Mountain girl hacks through dangerous social terrain as she hunts down her drug-dealing father while trying to keep her family intact. Directed by Debra Granik, this 2010 dramatic mystery stars Jennifer Lawrence and John Hawkes.
